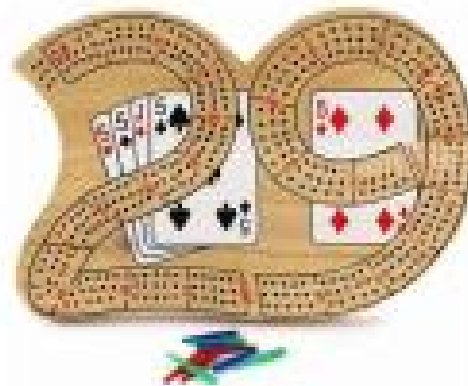

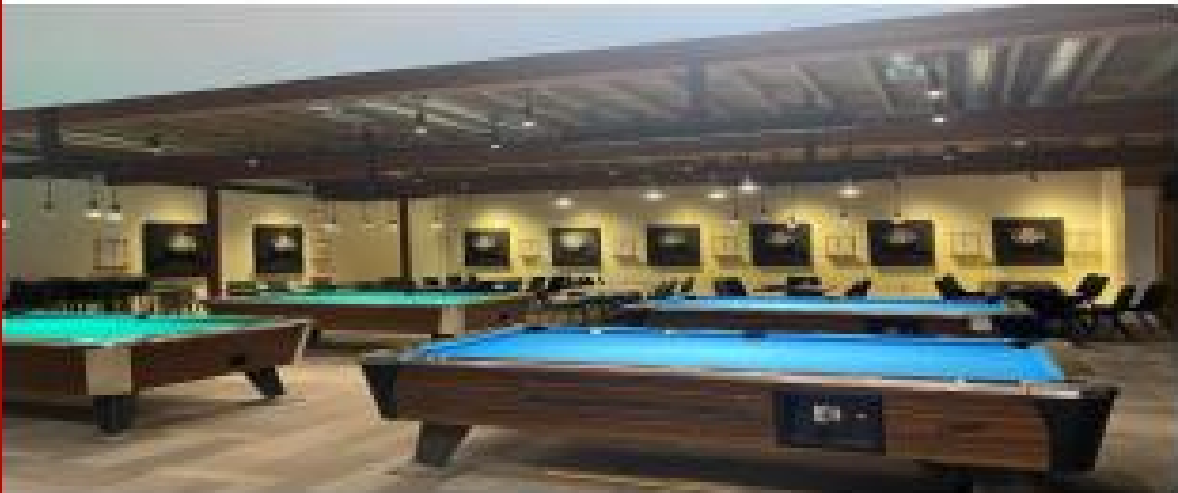
Finally, in closing, this is another reminder that if you have yet to pay your annual dues, please do and it is a great opportunity to see your beautiful new branch.

## **The Veterans Independence Program (VIP)**

The Veterans Independence Program (VIP) provides annual tax-free funding for services such as grounds maintenance, housekeeping, meal preparation, personal care, and professional health and support services.

This program does not replace other federal, provincial or municipal programs. Instead, it is intended to work with those programs to help meet your needs.

Note: If you think you may have a need for these services, be sure to complete the Veterans Independence Program application at the same time as your Pain and Suffering Compensation application. If approved, this will allow you to access support at the earliest possible date.

### **Do you qualify?**

You should apply for the Veterans Independence Program if you need home care services and you:

- have qualified for a disability benefit, or
- have qualified for the War Veterans Allowance, or
- receive Prisoner of War Compensation, or
- are eligible for, but can't access, a Contract Bed (also known as a Priority Access Bed) in a long term care facility.

There was no Old Business and no New Business to be addressed at this time.

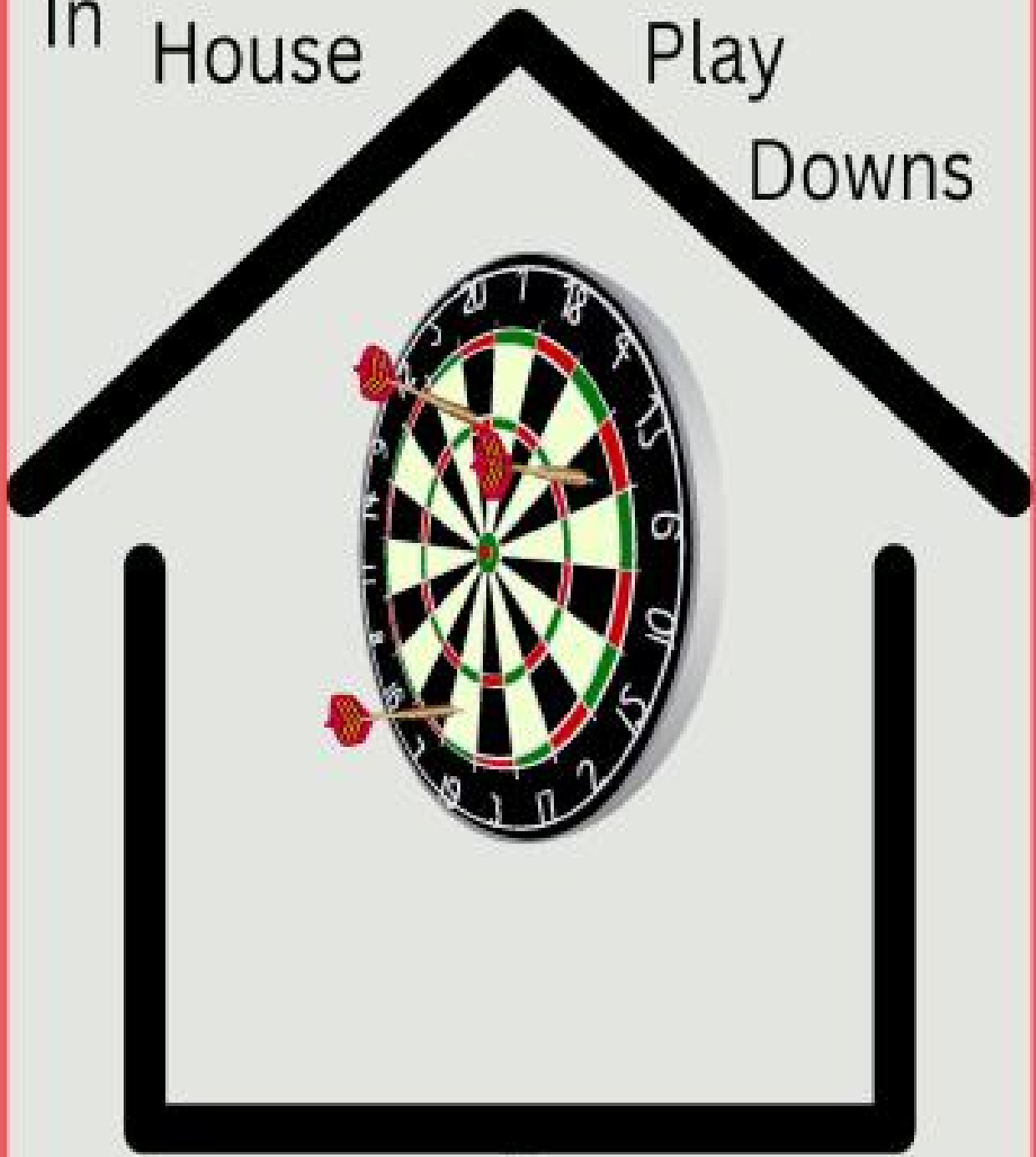
Our next meeting is scheduled for 1 pm on November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

## **ELECTIONS ARE COMING!**

**Elections are coming in November. The 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Treasurer, six Executive Members “at large” positions and four Zone Representatives are up for election. If you would like to run, please see the Nominating Chair, or Sandy in the office for a Nomination Form. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor at the General meeting on **NOVEMBER 27<sup>nd</sup>**.**

### **5. NOMINATIONS**

- 5.1 At least three (3) months prior to the election meeting, the Branch Executive Committee will either appoint (a) a Nominating Committee of three (3) members, or (b) a Chairman, who will then appoint two (2) other members who combined, will form the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee members should have signified they do not intend to stand for office. However, after being stood down, any member of the Nominating Committee can be nominated from the floor.<sup>1</sup>
- 5.2 At the November General Meeting the Nominating Committee shall present a list of suitable candidates for office. These candidates must be voting members in good standing who are not employed by the Legion. This shall not prevent any nominations of similar candidates from the floor at that General Meeting or at the election meeting that will be held in December.<sup>2</sup>
- 5.3 As appropriate and as per subsections 6.2 and 6.3 of these By-Laws, nominations from the floor for the offices of Branch President, First and Second Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and, six (6) Executive members “at large” will open at the November general meeting and remain open until immediately prior to balloting for each office at the December general meeting.
- 5.4 To accept a nomination, a member is required to have held membership in The Royal Canadian Legion for a period of at least one (1) continuous year

<sup>1</sup> Note the “bold” amounts are not shown in the By-Laws. This is so that dues can be set by the membership from time to time without the Branch having to obtain consent to a change in its By-Laws then. Comment.

<sup>2</sup> The notice of Notice serves to inform all members of the pending change in dues.

<sup>3</sup> Most Branch by-laws will say it is the “general” meeting that must appoint or elect the Nominating Committee/Chairman. However, with giving the Executive Committee the power to make these appointments it is incumbent upon the Executive to ensure they do not end up in a “conflict of interest” position. An example of a perceived conflict of interest would be the appointment to Nominating Chairman of (a) the spouse of the current Branch President (b) paid employees (c) current members of the Executive Committee.

<sup>4</sup> The Nominating Committee may (gg) include any of its members’ names on the list.

immediately preceding the day of election and must be a member in good standing.

- 5.5 For a member to be eligible for nomination to the office of Branch President, the member must have served at least one full term on the Branch Executive within the three years immediately preceding the elective year.
- 5.6 If a nominee is unable to be present at the election meeting, he must have signified in writing, his willingness to stand for the office for which he has been, or is being nominated.

## 6. ELECTIONS

- 6.1 At the November General Meeting the President shall appoint an election committee consisting of a returning officer and as many scrutineers as the President deems necessary, these appointments to be ratified by the General Membership.
- 6.2 At the December General Meeting, on "even" years (ie: 2012, 2014, etc), the election of officers and members of the Executive Committee of the Branch shall take place in the following consecutive order: President; First Vice-president; Second Vice-president; Treasurer; and, six (6) Executive members "at large". The President, First Vice-President, Second Vice President and Treasurer shall serve for a two (2) year term. The six (6) Executive members "at large" shall serve for a one (1) year term.
- 6.3 At the December General Meeting, on "odd" years (ie: 2013, 2015, etc), the election of six (6) Executive members "at large" shall take place, all of whom will serve for a one (1) year term.
- 6.4 The ballots shall be counted by the plurality system and no ballots shall be destroyed until so ordered by the general meeting.<sup>4</sup>
- 6.5 In the case of a tie vote for any office, a second ballot shall be called for.
- 6.6 The Branch Executive Committee shall consist of the President; Immediate Past-president; First and Second Vice-presidents; Treasurer and, six (6) Executive members "at large".
- 6.7 All Executive Committee members identified in subsection 6.6, must be voting members in good standing who are not employed by the Legion.
- 6.8 The newly elected Executive members shall be installed at the earliest convenient time after January 1<sup>st</sup> of each year following the election.

<sup>4</sup> A plurality vote means the candidate receiving the highest number of votes is declared elected. If in multiple office such as the Executive Members, the number of officers required that receive the most ballots if one vote are to be declared elected.

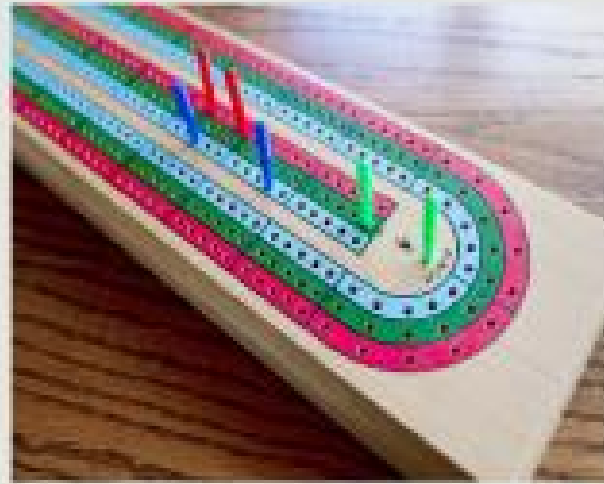
